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• The world: children know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things. They talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another. They make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.

 Technology: children recognise that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools. They select and use technology for particular purposes. familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world

Can talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects.

Treat equipment and the classroom with care, taking care to use things properly.

Observe the changing seasons – encourage children to paint pictures and draw what they see e.g. observational drawings of plants. Look for signs of growth where we planted carrots/potatoes. How do we look after our plants? What do they need in order to grow?

Use a PowerPoint to show the children the police/ firefighters etc and the jobs they do. Discuss with the children if we had thought of all these things.
