We follow the Cumbria Agreed Syllabus for RE, outlined, by Cumbria's Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education (SACRE). RE is taught for one hour each week, as well as during our Multicultural Celebration Weeks.

We use RE to support the teaching of British Values and its five values are defined as;

- 1- Democracy- Through discussion in RE pupils can realise the significance of each person's ideas and experiences.
- 2- The rule of law- In RE pupils examine different examples of codes for human life.
- 3- Individual liberty- In RE pupils consider questions about identity, belonging and diversity.
- 4- Mutual Tolerance- Learning about different ways of life and beliefs requires an understanding of difference.
- 5- Respectful attitudes- In the RE curriculum, mutual respect between those of different beliefs is developed, promoting an understanding of what society gains from diversity.
