Some other ideas for this week

### Reading and Writing

Try the Oxford Owl website (see above)

Enjoy reading books together. Look at a range of different books – stories, poems, information books and comics. Talk about favourite stories and characters.

Try writing using different materials – pencils, chalk, crayons and pens. Try writing letters in a tray of sand or flour using a finger or paint letters onto the ground using a paintbrush and water.

### Physical and Personal Development

Try some throwing and catching activities. Use anything you have at home – balls, bean bags, hoops. Can you catch with one hand?

Encourage your child to talk about their likes and dislikes in terms of activities they like and do not like to do. Encourage them to explain their thoughts and feelings.

Cut out pictures from catalogues and stick onto some paper to make a collage of favourite toys/colours/clothes/shoes

### Technology and Art

Go on a technology treasure hunt in your house. See what you can find in each room. – laptops, TV's, tablets, ipod, radio, CD player, phones etc.

Talk about how these things work and how to use them safely. How can they help us? For example we can use lots of devices to find out the weather – News broadcasts, apps, radio etc

Encourage children to sing their favourite songs and listen to music.

### Maths

Look for shapes around the house or when out on your daily exercise. Ask your child to describe the shapes. Encourage them to use words such as 'sides' or 'corners'. Build models or pictures using empty packaging or paper shapes and talk about the shapes used.
