Some other ideas for this week

Reading and Writing

Can you read and draw a picture to go with these sentences?

The rat is in the bath.

The cat has a long tail.

The glass is full of milk.

Don't forget to watch the Ruth Miskin Read Write Inc sessions on Youtube. Focus on Set 2 sounds.

Collect some objects from around your home. Ask a grown up to write some simple sentences about the objects. Read them one at a time, then point to the matching object. For example, 'This is a red ball.'

Have a go at the 'Reading tricky words' challenges.

Maths

Have a go at the Doubling problems.

Choose 2 different colours of paint and make stripes across the paper in 2 colours. Remember to change colour each time to make it a repeating pattern. Can you use the paint to make patterns with spots or circles? How many different patterns can you make with 3 colours of paint?

Collect 20 leaves from your garden or the park. Write the numbers 1 – 20, one on each leaf, using a marker pen. Use a hole punch to make a hole at one end of each leaf then thread them onto a piece of string. Make sure they are in the correct order. Perhaps you could try this with other numbers?

Other areas

Try and learn a new Nursery Rhyme.

You could try:

- I'm a little teapot
- Pop goes the weasel
- Sing a song of Sixpence

Play a describing game with someone at home. Choose an object that you can both see and describe it to the other player using three clues.

Make a musical instrument – Fill a clean, empty yoghurt pot with rice, cereal, lentils or dried beans. Stick a piece of paper over the top to make a shaker.

You could also put elastic bands over an empty box to make a guitar.

Ball skills - See how many times you can throw and catch a ball with a partner. Can you get up to 20 throws and catches without dropping the ball?

Art – Follow the instructions to make a newspaper pirate hat. Can you draw a treasure map? See if someone can follow your map to find some treasure! Can you turn your paddling pool or sand tray into a pirate ship?
