



Pupil Premium Statement 2018-2019

2018-2019 (September – July)

17 (including EYFS) pupils receive pupil premium funding (£19,920)

Due to small cohorts we will not list the number of children in each year group to prevent identification.

Following a review of the impact of the use of funding and research into best practise through the education endowment foundation and an analysis of the individual need of the pupil premium cohort funding this year will be used to contribute to:

Continue the use of precision interventions with targeted teacher and HLTA/TA support to narrow the difference.

- Funding will be used to ensure those children who are furthest behind peers receive additional support.*
- Programmes are delivered daily in small groups or 1:1 to those children who are showing gaps in their understanding of basic number, calculation concepts and literacy skills. The impact of intervention can be tracked half termly to ensure the progress is being made*
- Provide access to online learning programmes such as Purple Mash for children who need to improve their basic skills in Reading, Writing and Maths (£400)*

Provide 1:1 and paired support for individual children to help them to access the curriculum. Timetabled interventions are planned and delivered by HLTAs and TAs for all Pupil Premium children. These interventions are linked closely to children's individual progress. TAs also provide Pupil Premium children additional support to access lessons (£9900)

Our HLTA with specialist experience in providing emotional support delivers 2 Nurture Groups per week which are planned specifically to address social and emotional development and support. This enhanced support is for children who experience challenges that experience resilience, self-esteem and overall emotional well-being. School has worked with Barnardos and other outside agencies to support the more vulnerable children. (£5230)

Our curriculum provides opportunities for outdoor education that will impact positively on children's resilience, well-being and development of the characteristics of effective learning.

Training will also be provided for a mental health first aider and training for all relating to a culture which promotes mental health and well-being – an ever increasing challenge for many families and children. (£1150)

The school will also fund a member of the teaching staff to monitor and evaluate our provision and to hold Pupil premium progress meetings with other staff. The school will conduct a PP review at the cost of £400.

The school also provides support where needed for curricular enhancement opportunities such as theatre trips, adventure experiences and residential to promote independence and supports positive family interactions through a range of strategies. £2840
