Quality of Education

- 1) Staff to train in 'Attention Autism' to support the best possible outcomes for pupils with SEND across all areas of the curriculum.
- 2) Increase the number of pupils who reach at least the expected standard in Writing by the end of KS1.
- 3) EAL pupils who join the school will be fast-tracked for Reading.

Behaviour and Attitudes

- 1) Successfully implement the new DFE guidelines for attendance, embedding the 'Working Together' strategy.
- 2) Embed a rigorous system to support 'regulation' across the school to further support children's changing PSED needs.
- 3) Develop a 'special celebrations' calendar that represents the current cohorts across school to share multifaith/cultural celebrations as an entire school community.

Leadership and Management

- 1) Implement a staff wellbeing plan for this academic year, following the success of last year's wellbeing guidelines for all.
- 2) Increase allocated EY Leadership time so that the EY Lead is able to further support staff with needs within the unit.
- 3) The new SENCO will begin the accredited training programme, with ongoing support from the predecessor.
- 4) Develop a new 'Lead Governor' system to support the work-load balance for the entire governing body.

Personal Development

- 1) Continue to promote the take-up of extra-curricular activities so that disadvantaged pupils consistently benefit from the school's offer.
- 2) Implement the School Hub system for lunches to support the varying dietary needs of the school community.
- 3) Develop a specific unit for wrap-around care to support the increasing uptake from families.

Early Years

- 1) Increase the overall number of pupils who reach GLD by the end of the reception year.
- 2) Use 'Core Boards' across all areas of the EY provision to support speech development for SEND and EAL pupils.
- 3) Implement rigorous strategies to support children to become independent in toileting to improve outcomes in Physical Development.
 - 4) Continue to develop the outdoor areas to support the expansion in pupil numbers across the unit.
 - 5) Implement a 'visits' programme across the early years to further support the childrens' cultural capital.
